Development and Implementation of European Standards on Prevention of Occupational Skin Diseases (StanDerm)

Dear colleagues,

As 2014 is coming to an end, it is just timely to keep you abreast on the accomplishments achieved so far by our Action and on the activities expecting us in 2015.

A brief overview

- ✓ The second grant year started on 1 June 2014 and will end on 31 May 2015. Meanwhile, a total of 28 parties have joined our Action. Two international partner countries (IPC), namely South Africa and Argentina joined StanDerm during 2014.
- ✓ 13 STSM have been carried out and 4 are in the pipeline. Further applications for STSM in the 2nd grant year are most welcome as the budget is not exhausted yet (http://www.standerm.eu/short-term-scientific-missions.html).
- ✓ Two workshops (Bern, Amsterdam) and one scientific seminar (Barcelona) were organized during the year. All three events were very well attended with an average of 60-65 persons.
- ✓ The five working groups had an opportunity to pursue their work plan during separate meetings.
- ✓ The WG 3 sub-group on "UV skin cancer" met for the first time at the occasion of the workshop in Amsterdam (October 2014) and will continue its work on 25 February 2015 in Prague.

ISA 2015 29 July 2015 (4th International Summer Academy of Practical Dermatology): In October, StanDerm has been invited by the organizers (http://www.isa2015.com/) to hold a half-day seminar within the framework of its International Summer Academy from 3-7 pm on 29 July 2015 in Munich on the topic of

"Prevention of occupational skin diseases in Europe". A morning session from 11 am to 1:30 pm will in addition be devoted to an Early Stage Researchers Forum with abstract-driven presentations. All detailed information, including the *Call for papers*, will be posted on StanDerm's website very soon.

World Café results: Many thanks to all participants, who attended and actively contributed to the World Café held in Amsterdam. Without going into details at this stage, participants underlined that differences in diagnoses and treatment of OSD need to be overcome with common standards, that cooperation between dermatologists and occupational physicians has to be improved, that things can only be moved as a group and that therefore the exchange and cooperation between the WG need to be increased to ensure meaningful results from the activities undertaken by StanDerm.

Hence, based on the results of the World Café, WG 5 will further investigate the interdependencies between the different WG and their key activities. It will ask for the give and take between the groups and analyze the degree of interference between the different activities. The objective is to increase the transparency within StanDerm, to optimize the output of the project and to increase the impact of StanDerm on the outside world. To that end, WG 5 will hold a workshop from 19-20 March 2015 with representatives from all WG. We will get back to you on these relevant issues soon and may request your input to bring forward our objective of knowledge dissemination.
