Development and Implementation of European Standards on Prevention of Occupational Skin Diseases (StanDerm)

## Dear colleagues,

We are more than half-way through StanDerm's lifespan and can proudly look back at important achievements. This is abundantly reflected in the mid-term progress report submitted to the COST rapporteur in December. In a *nutshell:* 

- ✓ Over 140 experts from 31 countries Montenegro was just approved
- ✓ Two IPC countries: South Africa and Argentina

- ✓ One statement to the CLH public consultation related to the classification of MCIT/MIT
- Submission of two proposals to HORIZON 2020 PHC 4 and PHC 6, yet unfortunately rejected

The above is just a selection of our activities to demonstrate that concerted action can push things forward. This will no doubt spur us to continue efforts in achieving further meaningful results. Let us now have a preview on some milestones for the year ahead:

4<sup>th</sup> International Strategy Conference on Occupational Safety and Health (21-24 March 2016) Dresden <a href="http://www.dguv.de/isc/index.jsp">http://www.dguv.de/isc/index.jsp</a>: This event, hosted by the German Social Accident Insurance (DGUV) and organized with ILO, WHO, ISSA, ICOH and other national and international key OSH partners, will be taking a closer look at the top trends in what is currently being discussed in occupational safety and health. The Action chair has been invited to address the challenges of occupational skin cancer. Registration for the Conference is possible online only.

5<sup>th</sup> Skin cancer awareness Day (5-6 April 2016), Brussels: This will be the fifth year that a series of events will take place in Brussels to raise awareness of skin cancers among European decision-makers and other stakeholders. For StanDerm, this is a unique platform to bring forward its concerns with regard to a lacking comprehensive legislative framework to protect outdoor workers effectively and in improving prevention measures.

**3<sup>rd</sup> Training School (31 August – 3 September 2016), Modena:** Occupational skin cancer will be the focus of this third and last training school organized by StanDerm. With a mixture of lectures and practical work, participants will acquire more in-depth knowledge into the diagnostics and prevention of OSC. Information on the application procedure will be posted on our website in February 2016. Separate information will be disseminated soon.

**Core group meeting:** For strategic planning reasons (last grant year), it is envisaged to hold a core group meeting on Saturday, 3 September 2016 in Modena, Italy. *ALL working group chairs* will be requested to attend.

StanDerm workshop (12-14 October 2016), followed by a Management Committee meeting (14 October 2016), Krakow: Our next workshop is scheduled to take place from 12-14 October 2016 in Krakow. It is envisaged to organize one full day of separate working group meetings as no further meetings of the groups are planned afterwards.
